Missio worldwide

Missio England and Wales is part of the global network of Pontifical Mission Societies. Together, these 120 offices share the Gospel in countries where there is poverty. persecution, political turmoil and conflict.

The Holy Father has tasked Missio with encouraging the prayers and giving of all Catholics throughout the world, and the coordination of financial gifts so they get to where they are needed most and are distributed in a fair and equitable way.

You are contributing towards the support of 1,070 mission dioceses, the training of 23,000 future priests, and the education and protection of over 4 million children.

Nigeria

Missio continues to collaborate with the Women's Interfaith Council (WIC) in Kaduna State, Nigeria. This Council enables women of different faiths to work together to build peace and stability in one of the most troubled regions of Africa.

In 2024, skills acquisition training was conducted by the WIC for 35 women of different faith groups. They received education in different programmes, including fashion design, cosmetology, baking/cooking and bag-making.


Led by Sr Veronica, the project addresses the impact of poverty on vulnerable women and girls - regardless of their background or belief. Sr Veronica shares: 'The project seeks to enhance peacebuilding, interfaith relationships and business management skills... fostering economic empowerment, mutual understanding and respect, as well as social cohesion.

In addition to developing technical skills, participants also received training in small business management,

marketing and customer service; preparing them to successfully launch and manage their own ventures. Sessions on financial literacy and budgeting empowered participants to make informed decisions about pricing, expenses and revenue generation; ensuring the sustainability of their businesses in the long-term.

When asked about the outcome of this programme, Sr Veronica said, 'There was an increase in sources of livelihood for women and their families. Coping mechanisms and resilience of women in communities facing violent conflicts were enhanced. Gender-based violence was reduced, and there was increased economic activity in local communities.

'We keep on partnering to empower women and youth, and to put smiles on the faces of the vulnerable. Please extend our thanks and gratitude to all who supported Missio UK to fund this great project. We remain grateful to God for all that we were able to achieve in the year 2024. Your support and work of peacebuilding, empowerment of women and youth, and promotion of women's rights and equality is of tremendous significance. May God open more ways of our great collaboration.



Formed for the fire of mission

Cameroonian Br Bonaventure is in his ninth year of training to become a Mill Hill Missionary. Currently training in Kenya, he explains how it takes 10 years of formation to become a Mill Hill priest:

'The mission of the Church is to bring Christ to the world and the world to Christ. Our formation pillars - spiritual, intellectual, human, pastoral - shape me not just to speak of Christ, but to witness him with my whole life.

Spiritual formation grounds me through daily Eucharist, community and personal prayer, and spiritual direction. I am learning not just to pray, but to become a man of prayer. Pastores Dabo Vobis (22) affirms: "the priest is called to be a living image of Jesus Christ". Intellectual formation deepens my understanding of Scripture, theology and Church teaching, so I can "give the reason for my hope" (cf. 1 Peter 3:15) with clarity and love. Human and pastoral formation teach me to live with others in mutual respect and service.

In our second cycle of formation, students from different countries live in intercultural groups of four or five; cooking, cleaning, shopping and participating in the Prayers of the Church. This teaches responsibility, teamwork and flexibility. Meanwhile, witnessing different cultures' liturgical expressions has opened me up to new ways of "being Church".

In addition to my studies, the two-year mission experience

in parishes alongside our Mill Hill priests has taught me that mission is not simply presence. but effective presence: entering into people's lives, cultures and sufferings with Christ's love. My formation has shown me that real growth happens when both freedom and responsibility are nurtured.

As I approach the threshold of mission, I pray to be consumed by the fire of divine love. Thank you for making this journey possible.'

Since 1936, the Mill Hill Missionaries have been working in partnership with Missio through the Red Box programme in parishes across England and Wales.

There are currently 150 young men studying to become Mill Hill Missionaries throughout the world - 47 Cameroonians, 27 Kenyans, 35 Ugandans, 1 Congolese, 11 Filipinos and 29 Indians who are being formed for mission in MHM Formation Centres in India (34 students), the Philippines (7 students), Cameroon (25 students), Kenya (50 students) and Uganda (34 students).

Mill Hill Missionaries continue to love and serve in the following areas:

26 parishes in Africa: Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, South Africa, South Sudan and Uganda.

28 parishes in Asia: Cambodia, India, Malaysia, Pakistan and the Philippines.

India

Throughout 2024, the Catholic Church continued to be a beacon of hope to many people in India.

Fr Mareddy, the Rector of St John's Regional Seminary in Hyderabad, shared with us: 'Priests and the Religious play a very important role in contributing to education, healthcare and social services. They run many schools and colleges and provide good education. They also run hospitals, homes for elderly and for disabled people, leprosy homes, AIDS rehabilitation centres and addiction centres.'

Seminarians training to become Catholic priests are taught 'spiritual, intellectual, human and pastoral formation. They are given special


attention to face challenges, according to the situations in the region,' Fr Mareddy explained.

Br Joseph, one of the students training for the priesthood and currently being sponsored through Missio, wanted to share this message with you: 'God's wonderful works are done through many souls to reach the people who are in need, spiritually and financially, and I am really happy to be the beneficiary of your support. I am ever grateful to you for your generosity in sharing your resources for my priestly formation in St John's Regional Seminary, Hyderabad. I am thankful for your prayers on my way to sacred priesthood.'

Every year, the global Missio network supports the training of over 23,000 future Priests and 8,000 Religious Sisters by providing young churches in developing countries with funding to train their own future Church leaders.

Thanks to our school supporters and volunteers, thousands of pounds are raised each year to help fund Missio's overseas children's projects – such as our work with children in Cameroon.

In 2024, Pope Francis chose the theme 'Go and invite everyone to the


banquet', and through our appeal we invited parishioners to find out more about the work of missionaries in Lebanon and Mongolia as they work alongside local communities.






MISSIO INCOME 2024

Missio also sent £157K of restricted funding to support mission projects in DRC, Cameroon, India, Kenya, Lebanon, Malawi, Mongolia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Peru, Sri Lanka and Uganda for the construction and repair of churches, seminaries and multi-purpose halls, and for the education of children. Mission Emergency funds were sent in response to flooding in Kenya and India.

Missio also sent **£60K** in Mass Stipends to missionaries overseas.

The income from the Red Box is shared 60/40 between Missio and the Mill Hill Missionaries. Missio's share supports missionary dioceses and the spread of the Gospel overseas. For the Mill Hill Missionaries' share, please see the next column.


